Superintendent's Message

By the time you read this newsletter, we will be in the middle of the holiday season. Thanksgiving will have come and gone and soon our students will be on an extended holiday break into the New Year.

The new calendar year will present numerous challenges for the District. As the economy continues to struggle and its effect is being felt by those in our communities, we will have begun work on the budget process for the 2011-2012 school year. Contained in this newsletter is the School Board budget calendar for the remainder of the school year. Your input during this process is invaluable as it will help us develop a budget that impacts the education of our current and future Vikings.

As part of the budget process, we will be taking into account comments from exit polling taken during last May's budget vote. The two areas with the most comments were programs and capital construction.

The majority of comments about programs were in regard to staffing and academic offerings. The largest portion of any school budget comes from the costs related to instructional personnel and those that directly support the academic programs. Support personnel include aides that work directly with our special education students. This section of the budget also includes placements for students in BOCES and other offsite special education programs. As a small rural district, we utilize outside placements because we are unable to staff and provide all the necessary specialized programs to meet the needs of these Vikings. Our challenge is how to best utilize our teachers and staff to meet the academic needs of all our students in the most efficient way possible. This includes prioritizing programs such as we recently did at the primary level. Through the use of

federal grant funding, we were able to add a second section in first grade. We will use a similar process as we continually evaluate our academic programs to prioritize them to address the needs of our students.

The topic of capital construction was also an area of high interest on the exit polling. As stated in the November newsletter, the recently completed Building Condition Surveys will play an important part as we look to address the needs of our facilities. As part of this process, we want to create a board advisory team made of community, business and staff members to look at the surveys, floor plans, academic programs, fiscal costs and other information to create options for the School Board. Many of the comments were about whether the District should be two buildings or one. This is a topic that should certainly be explored and evaluated by the advisory team as to the possible costs and benefits to the community and its students. If you would like to be a possible member of this advisory team, please contact Gail Burpee at the District Office to provide her with your contact information. We will select a cross section of those interested to insure all groups are well represented.

With more possible decreases in State Aid, it is more important than ever that we have the input of community members. By brainstorming ideas together, we can make short- and long-term plans to ensure the continuing success of all our Vikings. We look forward to hearing from you.
